



Bunyip North Battery Energy Storage System

Supplier information fact sheet | July 2026

Project overview

The Bunyip North Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) (the Project) is a proposed 400 megawatt (MW) / 2,400 megawatt-hour (MWh) battery energy storage facility located approximately 3 km north of Bunyip and 80 km south-east of Melbourne, within the Cardinia Shire local government area.

The Project is being developed by RES, an independent renewable energy company that has operated in Australia since 2004 and has developed wind, solar and energy storage projects across Victoria. The planning application is made by Bunyip North Project Co Pty Ltd, a company wholly owned by RES and established specifically to own and develop the Project.

The Project would connect to the existing 220 kV transmission network via a new terminal station proposed as part of the Project – the Bunyip North Terminal Station. Once operational, the BESS would store electricity from the grid when supply is plentiful and release it when demand is high, helping to support grid reliability and Victoria's transition to renewable energy.

The Project is currently in the development and approvals stage. Subject to approvals, construction timing and procurement pathways will be confirmed as the Project progresses.



Supplier commitments

RES recognises the importance of local, regional and First Nations businesses in supporting major infrastructure projects. Where commercially and technically suitable, the Project aims to provide opportunities for West Gippsland, Cardinia Shire and First Nations suppliers across construction and operations.

Engaging these suppliers can:

-  Help ensure the Project benefits the communities closest to it.
-  Build long-term capability.
-  Support the local and regional economy.
-  Reduce transport and logistics impacts.

Procurement approach

At this stage, RES anticipates that the Project may be delivered through an Engineering, Procurement and Construction (EPC) delivery structure. As with all major projects, the final procurement approach will be reviewed closer to construction to ensure it remains appropriate.

This means that:

- Supplier opportunities may be engaged via the EPC contractor.
- Other goods and services may be sourced directly by the Project or its contractors.
- Local and First Nations businesses are encouraged to register their interest early so their capabilities can be considered as procurement planning progresses.

Potential supplier opportunities

Based on early project planning, supplier opportunities may arise across areas such as:

- Civil and earthworks trades, including site establishment, fencing, access roads and intersection works
- Electrical trades and support services
- Plant, equipment and tool supply
- Fuel and water supply
- Vehicle servicing and maintenance
- Accommodation, catering and hospitality
- Cleaning, waste and general services
- Landscaping, revegetation and maintenance services
- Security, traffic management and site support services.
